Snowdrop currently offers the training modules listed below. We are passionate about delivering engaging and informative training suited to the specific needs of your organisation, therefore the modules below can each be adapted according to your training needs. You can choose individual or multiple modules that are relevant to you. Each module lasts about 3 hours and includes a training booklet for each participant.

Background to trafficking

Learn the foundational knowledge of human trafficking in the UK – the definitions, the indicators, the barriers to disclosure, the UK support systems, common issues post-NRM, complex challenges and safeguarding, and potential outcomes for survivors.

Psychological and biological effects of trafficking

Understand the diverse but profound effect human trafficking can have on a person's mental and physical wellbeing and how this impacts on daily living. Consider a few basic support techniques for helping someone deal with these symptoms

Working with survivors in the community

Obtain in depth teaching which allows the group to explore practical aspects of long-term support such as building trust, working with interpreters, creating needs-led support plans. Finish with group work considering the support needs and trials of a complex case study

Anti-oppressive practice and empowerment

These are key elements to providing support to any vulnerable people group in the community. Exploring these ideas will allow you to consider how to keep yourself safe, your client safe and encourage the best possible outcomes for everyone involved.

Grooming

Learn about different methods used in the grooming cycles, potential indicators and explore intervention ideas through three in depth case studies

Asylum and the NRM

Explore the interplay between the NRM and the asylum system and the impact of positive and negative conclusive grounds decisions on a person's wellbeing and support needs. Explore the different rights and entitlements of individuals at different stages of their journey.



How long?

Each module lasts about **2-3 hours**

Cost?

Cost of training depends on the organisations type and the size of the group being trained, plus any necessary travel or accommodation costs. The price covers the training materials, preparation and time of the trainer.

Who?

Training modules have been run for both statutory and voluntary service bodies ranging from police, social services, mental health services, anti-trafficking charities, adult safeguarding, housing support agencies, universities, drug and alcohol agencies and youth work programmes.
